

Clashes at Al Aqsa as Gaza truce holds

The truce between Israel and Hamas faced an early test vesterday when clashes broke out between Palestinians and Israeli police following Friday prayers at Jerusalem's Al Haram Al Sharif. Palestinians rallied by the thousands in Gaza and the West Bank, with many viewing it as costly, but clear victory for Hamas. Israel vowed to respond with a "new level of force" to any further rocket attacks. The US and Egypt, which mediated the truce, have now turned their focus on the Gaza humanitarian crisis | MIDDLE EAST, P9
